

Judith F. Dolkart, Deputy Director for Art, Education & Programs, happily announced the return of school groups and seniors, and a goal to bring back guided tours in January. Virtual tours are still available.

VII. FINANCE REPORT

Rob Bowen, CFO & EVP, Finance & Operations, delivered a financial update.

I. 2021 FY Audit Results

- 1. Plante Moran has issued an unmodified opinion (highest level of assurance) on the financial statements, stating that:
- a. The statements present fairly the financial position of the DIA
- b. The DIA's analysis for accounting entries is appropriate
- c. Reasonable judgments and consistency have been applied
- d. Financial Statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear
 - e. Strong cooperation and communication between the DIA and Plante Moran

II. FY 2022 Operating Overview

1. The Fiscal Year started with the DIA operating at a reduced schedule (27% fewer hours) with limited visitor capacity. The DIA has gradually increased operations to what is now approaching pre-pandemic levels.

- 2. In October, the DIA expanded hours by reopening on Tuesdays and extending hours on Friday evenings.
- 3. Also, in October, The Detroit Film Theatre began offering films in the auditorium and music and family programs have returned to the in-museum schedule.
- 4. Group visits have returned to the museum, with students returning in October and senior groups in November.

III. FY 2022 Financial Summary

- 1. The DIA's financial performance has been better than budget for the first three
- 2. months of the 2022 fiscal year.
- 3. Revenue is \$300,000 unfavorable to budget for the Quarter
- 4. Expenses are \$200,000 favorable to budget
- 5. Unrestricted operating results are \$500,000 favorable to budget
- 6. Spending from restricted funds is within plan

Nina Holden, Senior Vice President & Chief Development Officer, Development Operations, provided an overview of recent activity.

IX. ENRICHMENT

Denene De Quintal, Assistant Curator of Native American Art presented a recent acquisition of four ceramic dolls, *Create Our Future – Honor Our Past*, by Kathleen Wall.

X. UPDATE FROM BOARD LIAISON

Rhonda Welburn reported no activity.
